

Understanding Hydrocephalus in Children

Hydrocephalus is a condition where is increase in the cerebrospinal fluid (CSF) occurs in the brain. CSF is a clear fluid that surrounds the brain and spinal cord, protecting them from injury, delivering nutrients, and removing waste. In a healthy brain, CSF flows through channels and is eventually absorbed into the bloodstream. However, in hydrocephalus, this fluid doesn't drain properly, causing it to accumulate. The result is increased pressure inside the skull, which can damage brain tissue over time.

In children, hydrocephalus can be congenital (present at birth) or acquired (developing after birth). Congenital hydrocephalus may be caused by genetic conditions or problems during fetal development. Acquired hydrocephalus can result from infections such as meningitis, brain tumors, head injuries, or bleeding inside the brain.

Signs and Symptoms:


The signs of hydrocephalus vary depending on the child's age.

- In infants, symptoms may include:
- o Rapid head growth
- o Bulging or tense soft spot (fontanelle) on the head
- o Vomiting
- o Sleepiness or irritability
- o Poor feeding
- o Eyes that seem to look downward (sunsetting eyes)
- In older children, signs might include:
- o Headache
- o Nausea or vomiting
- Blurred or double vision
- Trouble with balance or coordination
- o Delays in development or decline in school performance
- Personality changes

Diagnosis and Treatment:

Doctors diagnose hydrocephalus using brain imaging techniques such as ultrasound (in infants), CT scan, or MRI. Once diagnosed, hydrocephalus usually requires surgical treatment.

The most common treatment is the placement of a **shunt system**. A shunt is a flexible tube placed in the brain to drain excess fluid into another part of the body, often the abdomen, where it can be absorbed. Another option in some cases is a procedure called **endoscopic third ventriculostomy** (ETV), where a small hole is made in the brain to allow CSF to flow more freely.



Hydrocephalus is a lifelong condition, and shunts may need to be revised or replaced as a child grows. Children with hydrocephalus may face developmental, physical, or learning challenges, but with early diagnosis, proper treatment, and supportive care, many lead full and active lives. Regular follow-ups with a pediatric neurologist or neurosurgeon are important to monitor the condition.

Although hydrocephalus can sound frightening, understanding the signs and seeking prompt medical attention can make a significant difference. With modern treatment options and continued medical support, children with hydrocephalus can thrive.

CSSD Lecture: Tomson Paul on Instrument Recall

In a focused session for hospital staff, Tomson Paul highlighted the importance of monitoring sterilization through chemicaland biological indicators, explaining that any positive indicator—signaling equipment malfunction—triggers an immediate recall. He emphasized that all instruments from the affected cycle and any processed afterward must be promptly identified, quarantined, and reprocessed under documented procedures. His key message: monitoring plus a clear recall policy ensures CSSD quality and safeguards patient safety.










Representing Kingdom of Bahrain on the Global Stage
