Using the ArgoCap Device in the Treatment of Barrett's Esophagus

We used the ArgoCap device on a patient suffering from Barrett's Esophagus, marking the first use of this technology in the Middle East, under the supervision of Dr. Maheeba Abdulla Consultant Gastroenterologist & Hepatologist, Dr. Jehad Al-Qamish Consultant Gastroenterologist & Hepatologist & Internal Medicine, and Dr. Pradeep Bandari Specialist in Gastroenterology and Advanced Endoscopy.

Barrett's Esophagus is a condition that harming the surrounding healthy tissue. affects the esophagus, leading to changes in the mucosal lining as a result of continuous exposure to stomach acid. This condition is considered a risk factor for the development of esophageal cancer. To diagnose and treat this condition, various medical devices have been developed, including the ArgoCap device.

ArgoCap is an innovative device used in endoscopic techniques for treating acidrelated conditions such as Barrett's Esophagus. The device works through targeted inflation of esophageal tissues, helping to safely and effectively remove damaged tissue. It is one of the latest tools that allow physicians to deliver precise treatment to the affected areas without

In the case of the patient who underwent treatment with ArgoCap, he was suffering from Barrett's Esophagus due to persistent acid reflux. During therapeutic endoscopy, the ArgoCap device was used to enhance the accuracy of the procedure and increase safety while removing the damaged tissue.

Benefits of ArgoCap in Treating Barrett's **Esophagus:**
